Punctuality Matters!



Being punctual sets a positive tone for the day! The first 10-15 minutes per day is crucial; usually children use this time to address any misconceptions from the previous day's learning; complete a challenge set by the teacher; or engage in independent basic skill development using ICT. This is why, being in school on time is so important!

Many families use our breakfast club facility, this starts at 8:00am daily, and booking is simple via ParentPay. If you drop your children off between 8:30am and 8:35am, breakfast club is free. But please understand, that doors close promptly at 8:35am. The school gate opens at 8:45am and closes at 8:55am to welcome children into school. Additionally, please ensure timely pick-ups at 3:05pm for Reception and year 1, and 3:10pm for years 2


This marks the beginning of an exciting project with the Arts Council Wales, collaborating with Jo Munton of Vagabondi Puppets.

A Polite Reminder About Lunches

It's vital that you choose their meals together, as some parents choose the 'healthy option', but the children simply do not eat it.
