Learning About Healthy Relationships with Spectrum Cymru

At our school, we believe it's never too early to start teaching children about respect, kindness, and understanding. That's why we were so pleased to have welcomed Sian from Spectrum Cymru back into school for a series of workshops about healthy relationships and domestic abuse awareness.



Sian has visited us three times this term, delivering age-appropriate sessions to classes across the school. From learning about friendship and kindness in the younger years to exploring respect, personal boundaries, and recognising unhealthy behaviours in the older year groups, the workshops have been informative, engaging, and thought-provoking.

Children were encouraged to think about what makes a relationship safe and supportive, how to speak up if something doesn't feel right, and who they can talk to if they're worried. These important messages were delivered in a way that was sensitive, accessible, and empowering. We're incredibly grateful to Sian and Spectrum Cymru for supporting our school community with this vital work. These sessions not only link with our health and wellbeing curriculum but help equip our children with the knowledge and confidence to build positive relationships now and in the future.

Year 6 Cycle Proficiency Workshop

Our Year 6 learners recently took part in the Bikeability cycle proficiency workshop, developing essential skills for safe cycling. They learned how to check their bikes, signal clearly, control their speed, and navigate junctions with confidence. After practising on the playground, they proudly took to the roads around our school, putting their new skills to the test. It was wonderful to see their confidence grow as they rode safely and responsibly. This experience has not only taught them how to cycle safely but also given them greater independence.
