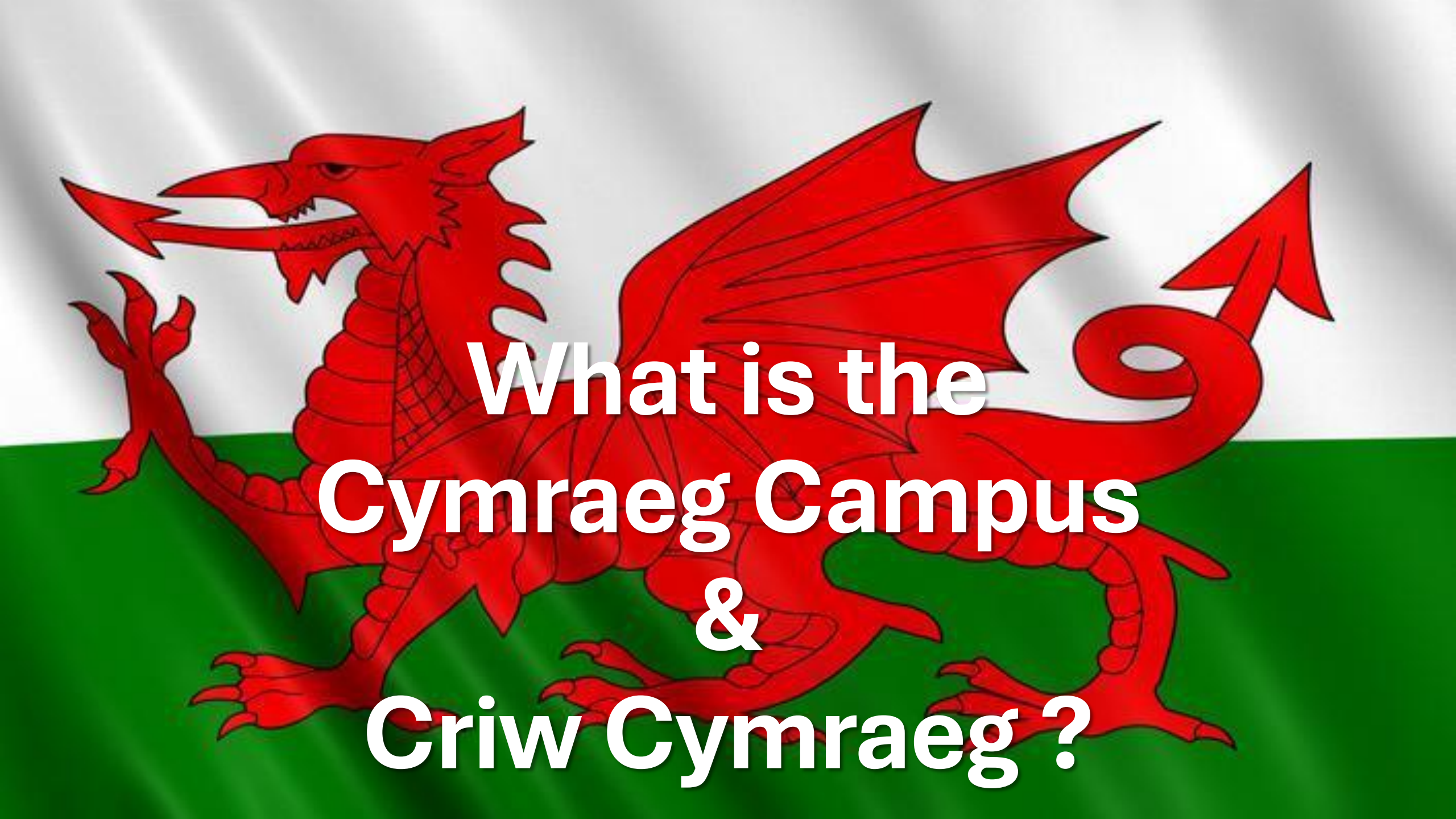

9 Aspects of one subject is taught through the medium of Welsh

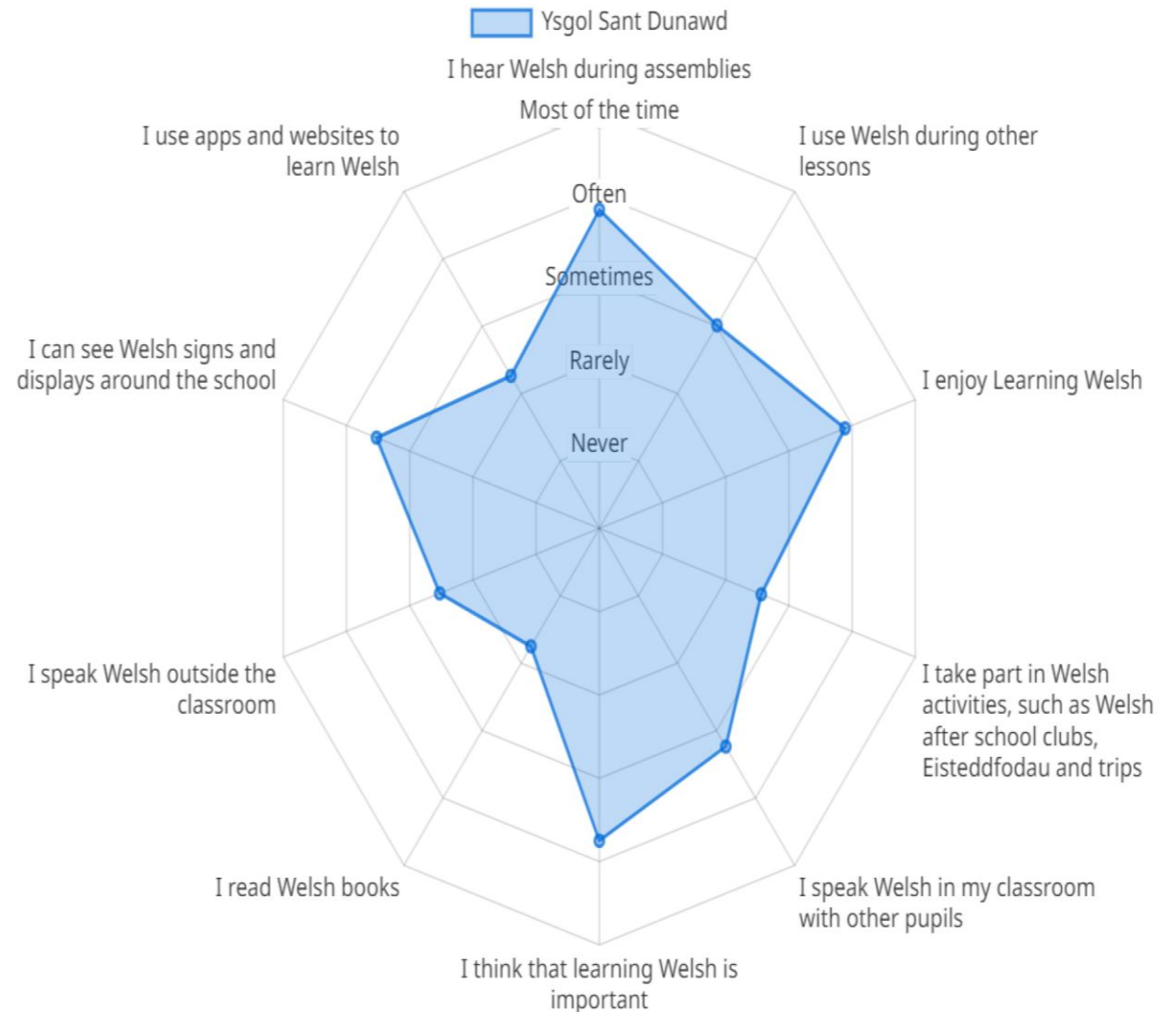
10 Many of the pupils have a positive attitude towards learning Welsh
